"You do not realize now what I am doing, but later you will understand."

"A new command I give you: Love one another. As I have loved you, so you must love one another. By this everyone will know that you are my disciples, if you love one another." (John 13:34-35)

"Now that I, your Lord and Teacher, have washed your feet, you also should wash one another's feet."

"Very truly I tell you, no servant is greater than his master, nor is a messenger greater than the one who sent him." (John 13:16)

"Jesus knew that the Father had put all things under his power and that he had come from God and was returning to God" (John 13:3)
